Add animals that you might find in that habitat.• Create a model of the earth –can you show where the hot and cold places are?• Learn the names of the 7 continents and some countries that are in those.• Learn the names of the five oceans.	<p>Science</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Draw an animal from a cold place and an animal from a hot place. (Label the body parts of each animal)• If you have a pet – help to take care of it for a week and write down what your pet needed. 	<p>Art</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Create a collage using hot or cold colours.• Draw animals using different media (pens, pencils, chalk, felt-tips, crayons...) Write sentences to say what you have done and describe things that you have seen using punctuation and adjectives.• Take a photograph of an animal or find one online and write some interesting facts about your chosen animal.	<p>Maths</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Making sure number bonds up to and including 10 are practised. Then try 20.• Practise counting up to 100 and then backwards. Try counting in steps of 2s, 5s and 10s as an extra challenge.• Find 3D shapes using real life items.
